NOTE

Forest Department, Goa in association with Goa Bird Conservation Network (GBCN) is organising 3rd Bird walk at Tambdi Surla on 13/04/2019. Forest Department had already conducted two Bird Walks at Raia-Curtorim Wetland Complex and at Carambolim lake in the month of February and March respectively. Enthusiastic Participants from different Spheres of life participated in the event including College students, Bird Photographers, Naturalist and General Public. After organising two Bird Walks in Wetland areas the focus is now shifting towards the Woodland birds/ Forest birds.

Tambdi Surla is one of the famous birding hotspot of the State and more than 150 species of birds including Western Ghats endemics like Nilgiri Wood Pigeon, Malabar Grey Hornbill, Malbar Parakeet etc has been recorded in this area. The Birding trail of 4 km will pass through lush forests of Western Ghats, which is one of the Biodiversity hotspots of our country and ends at view point of the Surla falls at an elevation around 600 metres.

The reporting place for 3rd Bird Walk is at Tambdi Surla temple and reporting time is 7:30 a.m.
